










#### WHY CHOOSE TWO TYPEFACES?

Choosing one typeface that is interesting enough for headings and readable enough for long stretches of text is hard



#### Google Fonts

- / Improved quality
- Free
- Incomplete fonts
- Quality can still be hit or miss



- Consistently better quality fonts
- Flexible typefaces
- No more FOUT (flash of unstyled text)
- Costs \$50/year




Didot: High contrast

Proxima Nova: Medium contrast

Medium contrast typefaces are the easiest to read in long chunks because there's just enough differentiation but not so much that it starts to jumble together

Courier New: Low contrast
